



RECYCLING

RINSED & CLEAN ♦ NO FOOD WASTE ♦ NO PLASTIC GARBAGE BAGS

If San Juan Sanitation finds garbage in the recycling container, homeowners pay as if it were a garbage dumpster.

PAPER and CARDBOARD

Mail (junk mail, window envelopes, flyers)
Magazines, catalogs, newspaper, phone books
Computer paper
Books - hard & paperback
Food boxes, cartons & paper bags
Milk cartons & juice boxes
NO food -soiled paper/plastic/cardboard

PLASTICS

Plastic jars, bottles & jugs
Plastic dairy tubs
Shrink wrap & cellophane
Grocery bags
NO styrofoam packing, packing peanuts
NO plastic potting containers
NO food -soiled paper/plastic/cardboard
NO prescription vials

Recycling – **not in plastic garbage or grocery bags** -- go in and around the old cardboard bin next to the garbage bins (by the shop). Look for the signs and bins.

Homeowners can also bring their recycling directly to the dumpster, see Bob, Dave or Ti.

GLASS

Glass bottles & jars (any color)
NO mirrors & window, windshield glass
NO light bulbs, fluorescent light bulbs
NO ceramics or dishes

ALUMINUM & TIN CANS

Aluminum foil, foil trays

OTHER – not recyclable, but have a place to go

- wood (goes to the burn pile)
- food scraps (go to compost, but not meat scraps)
- animal waste (goes to dog waste stations)
- dead animals (go to the bone pile, see Bob, Dave or Ti)
- dirt, soil, yard waste (see Bob, Dave, or Ti)
- motor oil -- bring to shop (see Bob)
- batteries – dispose of by garbage bins

NOT RECYCLABLE

*aerosol cans - toxic containers (oil, antifreeze, pesticide, etc.)
knives or scissors - needles & syringes
disposable diapers - Depends
clothing – rags - rubber
cooking oil - paint - chemicals
household garbage – concrete - confetti
kitchen appliances*
